

## NORMS FOR AUTHORS

1. All contributions submitted for publication to *Anuario Filosófico*, both articles and book reviews, must be entirely unpublished, and must be original works of the submitting author. While they are being evaluated for publication or undergoing editing, they must not be submitted to any other publication. Once an article has been published, authors retain the right to use it freely, provided that they cite its original publication in *Anuario Filosófico*.
2. Articles and book reviews should ordinarily be written in Spanish.

### Norms for articles

3. Articles should be sent by email to Dr. Enrique Alarcón, at [ealarcon@unav.es](mailto:ealarcon@unav.es)
4. Articles will be submitted to a double revision by peer reviewers external to the Editorial Committee. They will be evaluated according to the following general criteria: the interest of the topic; the knowledge displayed of the state of the question; dialogue with the most relevant and current bibliography; the unity, clarity, coherence, equity and rigor of the argumentation; the appropriateness of the title, abstract and keywords, as well as the correctness of the English version of each of these; the proportionate extension of the text and footnotes; and the formal and literary elegance of the writing.
5. The Editorial Committee will normally communicate its acceptance or rejection of the submission within a period of two months, although on occasion the review process may take up to six months. The article will be returned to the author together with the evaluations of the blind reviewers. In June of each year, the Editorial Committee will make its determination as to which articles will be included in the miscellaneous issue that is published each December.
6. Contributors will receive a set of proofs, for immediate correction, if necessary. Once the article has been published, authors will receive a copy of the issue of *Anuario Filosófico* and 20 offprints free of charge.

### Format of articles

7. Articles should not be longer than 8,000 words including footnotes (50,000 characters including blank spaces).
8. On the first page of submitted articles, in addition to the name of the author, there must be included the title of the article in Spanish and English, an abstract of up to 75 words, and up to four keywords (with both the abstract and keywords in Spanish and English). On the last page, there must be included the name of the author, the academic institution at which he or she is employed, the postal address of the author's office, and his or her email address.
9. The section titles within the article should be formatted in SMALL CAPS and be numbered sequentially in Arabic numerals: 1. 2. 3., etc. Subtitles should be in *italics*, and should be numbered alphabetically: a) b) c), etc.

10. Footnotes should be brief. Citations within footnotes should be placed between double quotation marks (“like this”); they should also be brief. Square brackets can be used to clarify some term within a quotation, e.g. “the link between this [particular case] and the agent’s end”.
11. Bibliographical references must always be placed in footnotes, and never within the body of the text. They must use the following format:
  - a. For books: R. SPAEMANN, *Ética: cuestiones fundamentales* (Eunsa, Pamplona, 1987) 113-115.
  - b. For articles: R. YEPES, *Los sentidos del acto en Aristóteles*, "Anuario Filosófico" 25 (1992) 493-512.
12. Abbreviated references may be used in the following cases:
  - a. When only a single work by a given author is cited, the title may be abbreviated as follows: R. SPAEMANN, *op. cit.*, p. 108.
  - b. If more than one work by a given author is cited, the title must be repeated in abbreviated form: R. SPAEMANN, *Ética* cit., p. 95; R. SPAEMANN, *Lo natural* cit., p. 15.
  - c. The term "*ibidem*" may be used when a single reference is repeated in consecutive footnotes.

### **Norms for book reviews**

### ***Format of book reviews***

14. Book reviews must have been 600 and 1000 words.
15. If it is necessary to include citations from works other than the one being reviewed, the citation must be placed in the body of the text, in parentheses, following the formatting indicated in items 11 and 12, above. If the citation is from the book being reviewed, it is sufficient to include the page number, as shown: (p. 63), or (pp. 63-64).
